Law Gets AFPAAA Grant Association Continues To Defer PRSA Costs DINFOS Grad Badges

Captain James Law, Chief of Public Affairs for the 366th Wing at Mountain Home AFB, has received a \$100 scholarship from AFPAAA for achieving Public Relations Society of America accreditation.

Captain Law sought accreditation "to do something to improve myself professionally . . . And maintaining my accreditation will force me to continue pursuing learning opportunities in the future."

A second generation Blue Suiter, he was born at George AFB, graduated from the Air Force Academy in 1990, and, except for school breaks, has been in Public Affairs ever since. He completed DINFOS with honors and in 1998 earned an MA in mass communications with distinction from the University of Florida. Assignments have included Edwards AFB; Iraklion Air Station, Crete; and Ramstein Air Base, Germany.

In a letter to AFPAAA, Captain Law said, "Thank you so much for the \$100 scholarship . . . The AFPAAA is a great organization, and I look forward to continued membership in the future."

He is the fourth recipient of a scholarship award, joining previous recipients Captains Nicole Greenwood, Ann Knabe, and Naomi Russi.

The scholarships, part of an effort by AFPAAA and SAF/PA to improve the professional skills of the Air Force Public Affairs career field, are available to members of the Air Force Public Affairs Alumni Association who are accredited by PRSA or by the International Association of Business Communicators.

The scholarships do two things: they help improve the Air Force's future Public Affairs leaders; and they are a tangible benefit of membership in the Air Force Public Affairs Alumni Association. The Association provides the funds and SAF/PA administers the program and selects the recipients.

AFPAAA has set aside \$1,000 in its curent budget for scholarships that are available to four junior enlisteds – up to E-6; three civilians – up to GS-9; and three officers – up to O-4.



Be Careful With New Senior Military Retiree Health Benefits!

Whether you are 65 or a young'un, the 2001 Defense Authorization Act will have a profound effect on your medical care either now or in the future. For those of us still serving or who have retired, but have not reached 65 and Medicare eligibility, there is time before we have to do anything.

But for those at or near 65 there are some things to do, and, just as importantly, some things not to do.

First, don't cancel any Medicare supplemental insurance you are carrying now. Second, if you are 65, or will be before April 1, and not enrolled in and paying for Medicare Part B do so before the open enrollment period closes on March 31. Third, make sure your Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System (DEERS) data is correct.

The legislation provides longsought pharmacy and health care coverage for Medicare-eligible military retirees. The pharmacy program starts April 1 and medical coverage begins October 1. Pharmacy benefits include choosing from the military's National Mail

"What's In A Name?" Your Vote Will Decide To AFPAAA Or Not

Proponents of changing the name of the Air Force Public Affairs Alumi Association prevailed by an 8-1 margin at the last board of directors meeting. But board action alone can't change the name. In accordance with AFPAAA bylaws, only a vote of approval by the membership can change the name.

That means that the election ballot for the open slots on the

board of directors, which you will receive later this year, will also include the opportunity to vote for or against an Association name change.

An information sheet discussing the pros and cons of a name change, including financial ramifications, will be provided with the ballot to assist members in deciding how they choose to vote.

Terino Resigns From Board Of Directors, Communications Chair

John Terino, one of the original organizers and founders of AFPAAA, who has been a member of the board of directors and communications chairman since those posts were established, has resigned from both positions. Eighteen months remained on his term on the board. He had also served as the Association's secretary for its first five years and is a major contributor to the endowment fund.

Ina December 12th letter to Board of Directors Chairman Jim Hart, Terino said "It has been wonderful helping build AFPAAA with a lot of good people since 1993."

In accepting the resignation, Hart said, "On behalf of the board and the membership, pleaseknowhow valuable your contributions have been instarting and helping develop AFPAAA. Much of the Association's success is a direct result of your efforts... I regret that we will no longer have your leadership, stewardship and presence at future board meetings."

By a unanimous vote, AFPAAA's Board of Directors agreed to spend \$500 to fund the purchase of badges for Air Force graduates of the Defense Information School this year.

The approval continues a program that was initiated by a donation to AFPAAA of \$600 in 1998. The money came from a member who wished to remain anonymous. The donor's desire was for the badges to be presented by and in the name of the Association.

He was spurred to make the donation by a suggestion from SAF/PA Director Brigadier General Ron Rand that was made at the Annual Membership Meeting in Dayton.

The first AFPAAA badges were presented in December 1999 by then Chairman of the Board Mike McRaney. Since then, AFPAAA has tried to have a member at DINFOS for each presentation.

By sponsoring the badges, AFPAAA is helping SAF/PA make entering the Public Affairs career field a significant moment for each individual. At the same time badge sponsorship and participation in the event leaves a positive impression of the Association with the newcomers to the field that it is hoped will lead to membership throughout their career and into their post Air Force life.



Be Careful With New Senior Military Retiree Health Benefits!

Order Pharmacy Program, where there is an \$8 copayment for up to a 90-day supply; DoD retail outlets, where there is a 20 percent copayment; or non-network outlets, where there is a 25 percent copay and a \$150 deductible. Military pharmacies will still fill prescriptions at no charge.

If you are 65, or will be before April 1, you can use the pharmacy benefit without enrollment in Medicare Part B. Those who will be 65 after April 1 will need to have Medicare Part B to use the benefit.

Retirees and dependents who use Medicare will have Tricare as their second payer for medical treatment. It will pay out-of-pocket expense for Medicare covered services, as well as providing access to Tricare benefits which may not be covered under Medicare. Long-term care and some other services are not covered. Retirees 65 and over must be eligible for Medicare Part A and be enrolled in Part B to get these benefits.

Part B enrollment is vital. The \$50 monthly fee is usually deducted from Social Security payments. The annual enrollment period is from January 1-March 31, with coverage effective July 1. Those who decline coverage

at age 65, and then seek reinstatement, will be assessed a 10 percent penalty on monthly premiums for every year beyond age 65.

Details on enrollment in Part B can by obtained by calling Social Security at 1 800 772 1213 or from any Social Security office.

When the program is fully implemented and your Tricare enrollment is confirmed you may elect to discontinue your supplemental insurance. Until then you should not cancel your supplemental policies.

It is also important to ensure your medical records are current by going to the nearest military personnel office or by calling DEERS at 1 800 538 9552. Your address in DEERS will be used for mailing information to you about the new law, which you will receive from Tricare shortly. You are asked to be patient if you contact a Tricare office about the new law; it will take some time to get the staffs familiar with its provisions.
